14. FINANCIAL REPORTS

It is part of transparency and accountability that we give financial reports for monies given to us as upkeep for pastoral work and evangelization. We therefore urge Confreres in charge of writing these reports to comply with the requests of the Regional Bursar.

15. KASEMBO FARMS

The swimming pool at Kasembo Guest House is undergoing a complete facelift after some problems like leakage due to long life span. Five cows were purchased to add to the existing herd and a new incubator was acquired.

16. MARIANNHILL MISSION SCHOOL (MMS)

Officially opened on the 23rd January 2021, the facility is envisioned to become a long term investment project for the Missionaries of Mariannhill in Zambia, with minimal risks, as the project will always run at critical levels under the strict supervision of a team of Confreres. This investment itself becomes a fixed asset that is ring fenced and self-sustaining. Being a big investment, it indeed required a substantial start-up capital. Thanks to the donors from the Unit of Switzerland through the St. Joseph Campaign, who responded commendably towards this project!

The school is divided into two sections, namely Pre-School Level (Baby, Middle and Reception Classes), with the capacity to enrol about ninety (90) children.

Primary School level should run from grade one to seven. At the moment we only have from grade one to five. The total number of pupils at the school is 180 at present from Pre-school to grade five. At full capacity it can cater for 270 pupils
